You should receive an email with a link to confirm your account and from there you can access the module in [English](#) or [Welsh](#). Select the 'I am an Employee' button, and then the Category 'Health, Safety & Wellbeing'.

If your authority already subscribes to Learning Pool, you can click the button on your local site to take you directly to the All Wales Academy without the need to create another account.
